



OPEN ACCESS FOR GERMANY

More than 900 German institutions are eligible to participate in the agreement between Springer Nature and Projekt DEAL, meaning that corresponding authors affiliated with these institutions are eligible to publish their articles open access without being invoiced by Springer Nature. The agreement includes more than 2,200 hybrid journals and more than 400 fully OA journals across the Springer Nature portfolio.



What authors need to know:

- You must be the corresponding author of the article
- Article types eligible under this agreement are: Original Paper, Review Paper, Brief Communication, Editorial Notes+, Book Reviews+, Letters+ and Reports+
- You must be affiliated with an eligible institution
- You must explicitly state your primary affiliation in the published manuscript, which is the institution at which the bulk of the research for the article was conducted
- You must identify yourself during the author identification process (you will be asked to do this once your article has been accepted for publication). The institution selected during this process should be your primary affiliation, as this institution will be asked to verify eligibility and will be billed if the article is approved

+Hybrid journals only. Non-research articles in fully open access journals will not be covered by this agreement.

Benefits of open access:

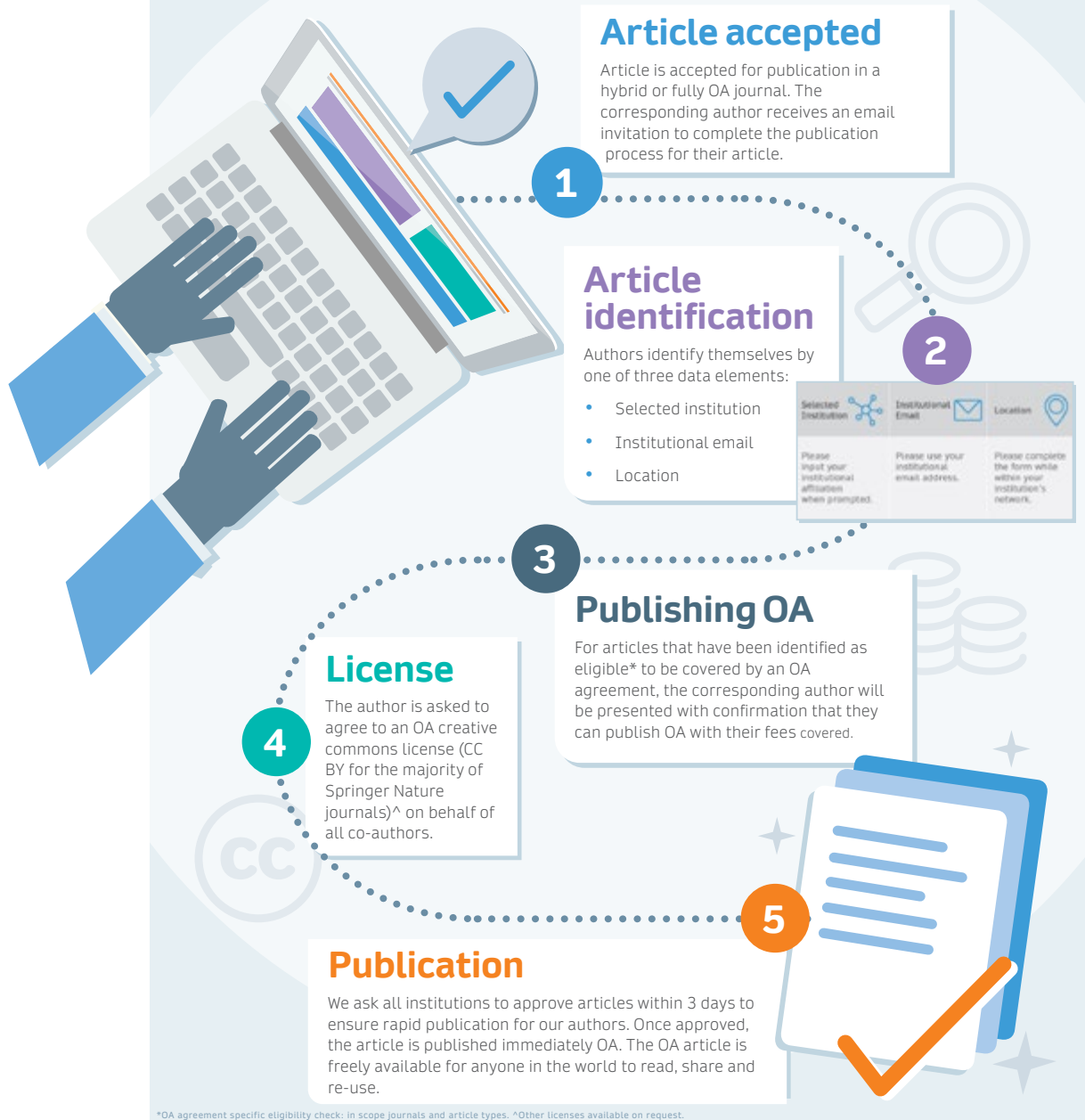
- **Increased citation and usage:** Studies have shown that open access articles are viewed and cited more often than articles behind a paywall
- **Wider collaboration:** Open access publications and data enable researchers to carry out collaborative research on a global scale
- **Greater public engagement:** Content is available to those who can't access subscription content
- **Faster impact:** With permissive licences like CC BY, researchers are empowered to build on existing research quickly
- **Increased interdisciplinary conversation:** Open access journals that cross multiple disciplines help researchers connect more easily and provide greater visibility of their research
- **Compliance with open access mandates:** Open access journals comply with major funding policies internationally

The corresponding author is the author who handles the manuscript and correspondence during the publication process. The corresponding author has the authority to act on behalf of all co-authors in all matters pertaining to publication of the manuscript, and acts as the point of contact for any enquiries after the paper has been published.
